## Accreditation Report

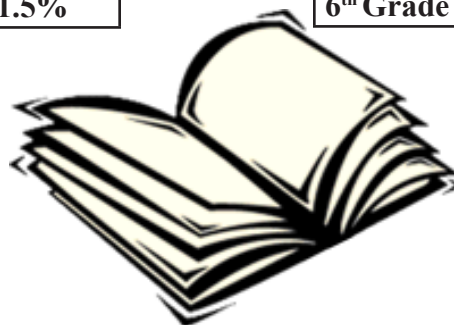

## **Adolescent Wellness Center**

The Mesick Adolescent Wellness Center is a cooperative health program between District Health Department # 10 and Mesick Consolidated Schools. Mesick Consolidated Schools provides facilities “in kind” in the Mesick Junior Senior High School and District Health Department #10 provides a licensed professional registered nurse and mental health counselor. The wellness center provides direct patient care to students in grades 7-12 and staff training/consultation district wide. Initial funding for the program is via a 5 year competitive grant from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and the Michigan Department of Education.

The wellness center is open two days per week and began operation in October 2011. Mental health services are offered twice per week and nursing services are currently once per week due to staff change over (will revert to twice per week in academic year 2015-2016). In academic year 2014-2015 the wellness center had 448 individual mental health visits and 354 individual nursing visits. The nurse serviced 136 unduplicated students while the mental health professional serviced 64 unduplicated students.

Services provided at the Mesick Adolescent Wellness Center include:

\*Professional Mental Health Therapy

\*General Medical and First Aid

\*Immunizations (the only service in which a fee is charged, fee is waived for those who cannot pay)

\*Reproductive Health Risk Counseling (no abortion counseling or contraceptive methods are given)

\*Nutrition Education

\*Laboratory Services: Rapid strep throat testing, rapid influenza testing, blood glucose testing, pregnancy testing and basic sexually transmitted disease testing

\*Health Insurance/Medicaid enrollment assistance and coordination
